- Ross Elliott: No specific comments after overall general discussions.

- Elaine McCommon: What kind of crimes have been happening?
Incidents, not specific crimes?
- Sherrie Paul: If the township has surplus money, grants, etc., then Stein Road needs looked at.
On a rainy day, you can't turn left or right off of Stein to Center. Called Township, no one returned call, although the mirror was fixed.
State Police response time is 6.2 minutes.
Any surplus should go back to residents or it should be invested.
Biggest concern: Using money of the taxpayers.
- Eric Clouse: Don't feel enough residents knew that this was being considered. Suggested a flyer be sent out or passed out.
- Dan Sanko: Great job on road work on St. Joe Road. Definitely now a speed issue.
Never heard the outcome of the recent incidents on Fallecker and St. Joe Roads.
Can we get a grant to pay for the police coverage?
