#### What is Fair Housing?

Fair housing is the right to choose housing free from unlawful discrimination.

The Fair Housing Act protects people from discrimination when they are renting or buying a home, getting a mortgage, seeking housing assistance, or engaging in other housing-related activities.

## Under the Fair Housing Act, it is Against the Law to:

- Refuse to rent or sell housing
- Tell you housing is unavailable, when in fact, it is available.
- Show you apartments or homes only in certain neighborhoods.
- Set different terms, conditions, or privileges for sale or rental of a dwelling.
- Advertise housing to preferred groups of people only.
- Refuse to provide you with information regarding mortgage loans, deny you a mortgage loan, or impose different terms or conditions on a mortgage loan.
- Deny you property insurance.
- Refuse to let you make reasonable modifications to your dwelling or common use areas, at your expense, if it may be necessary for you to fully use the housing.
- Refuse reasonable accommodations regarding a service animal or an assistance animal to a person with a disability.

### It is Unlawful to Discriminate in Housing Based on These Factors:

- Race or color
- National Origin
- Religion
- Sex
- Familial status (including children under the age of 18 living with parents or legal custodians; pregnant women and people securing custody of children under 18)
- Disability
- Use of guide or support animals or trainer of support or guide animals

### What to Do if You Have Experienced Housing Discrimination

#### **Document the Situation**

When documenting a fair housing issue please include:

- Your name and address
- The name and address of the person your complaint is against (the respondent)
- The address or other identification of the housing involved
- A short description of the alleged violation (the event that caused you to believe your rights were violated)
- The date(s) of the alleged violation

#### File A Complaint

If you believe your rights have been violated, contact HUD's Fair Housing Hub or a State or local fair housing agency to help you file a complaint. After your information is received, you will be contacted to discuss your concerns.
